#### COUNSELOR'S NOOK ...



Beginning with preschool and kindergarten, chronic absences (2 or more per month) correlate with reading difficulties and

poor attendance patterns in later years. One California study found that only 17 percent of students who were chronically absent in both kindergarten and first grade, were reading proficiently in third grade, compared to 64 percent of those with good attendance.

At Central Ridge Elementary, we recognize the importance of being here all day, every day. Being absent one day per month adds up to two weeks of instruction per year. We know there are extenuating circumstances this year because of COVID. However, if you have issues getting your child to school, whether transportation or behavior, please call me at extension 4009.
